

How to Propose and Handle a Motion

Knight: “Worthy Grand Knight, I make a motion that (state motion; if a sum of money is involved be specific).

Grand Knight: “There is a motion of the floor to (state motion). Is there a second?”

Another Knight: “Worthy Grand Knight, I second the motion.” (*Remember that seconding a motion does not mean that you necessarily agree with it; it just means that you think it is worth discussing.*)

Grand Knight: “There is a second. Is there any discussion?”

- The Knight who made the motion has the right to speak first on the motion.
- No Knight may speak on the motion more than twice.
- Discussion ends at the pleasure of the Grand Knight.

When the discussion concludes:

Grand Knight: “Discussion is now concluded. There is a motion to (state motion). All those in favor say “aye”. All those opposed say “nay”.”
